If you need any help registering or logging into the MySouthway Portal, contact us and we will guide you through it. Setting up a portal account is the most convenient way to manage your repairs, rent, and other things concerning your tenancy.

REMEMBER...

To be eligible for any reward prize draw, you will also need to meet the three main criteria and have:

A credit/zero balance on your rent account or you should be able to show you have stuck to your rent repayment agreement for 13 weeks or more

No breaches of your tenancy (e.g. good garden and property condition, no ASB etc.)

If you meet this criteria every month you have the chance to win a cash prize of **£500 or £250!**

You could be getting more.

Universal Credit

In November's latest budget announcement, we learned that Universal Credit work allowances will increase by £1,000 a year for working families and those with disabilities; this means you could have an extra £630 a year. (Announced in November's budget.)

If you're employed, your Universal Credit reduces as you earn more – for every £1 you earn, your payment reduces by 63p.

However, from April 2019, you'll be able to earn an additional £1,000 a year before your universal credit is affected. This is because you won't lose the 63p per £1 on this £1,000 (so you will get an extra £630 in your pocket!)

If you or your partner are responsible for a child or are living with a disability or condition that affects your ability to work, you're eligible for a work allowance. The work allowance is a set amount you can earn before your Universal Credit is reduced.

There are two levels of work allowances, depending on your circumstances:

- If you're getting help towards your rent you can earn £2,376 a year in your pay packet.
- If you're NOT getting help towards your rent you can earn £4,908 a year in your pay packet.

When you make a claim for Universal Credit there is a lot of information you must provide and sometimes filling out forms on the internet can be a bit daunting.


What if I get a family member to do Universal Credit online application for me?

Southway staff have also been busy adding to the wildlife garden at our new Didsbury office.



CELEBRATING OUR FIRST SECTION 106

In September, we celebrated the completion of our first Section 106 onsite at The Larches in Wilmslow.

A Section 106 is an agreement between a private developer and the council; this means the developer has to provide a certain number of affordable homes on a new development as part of the planning permission.

We marked the special occasion by gifting hampers to the residents who have recently moved into the three affordable-rent bungalows. Karen Mitchell, Chief Executive at Southway, David Squires Head of Neighbourhoods at Southway, and Andy Morgan from Elan Homes were accompanied by members of Southway's Development Team who played a key part in the completion of the scheme.

As well as providing much-needed affordable housing, the properties have been designed to offer accessibility for tenants with mobility issues. Our new tenant commented that the simple layout of the bungalow has eased her day-to-day living.



Southway has acquired a further 36 homes so far this year through the benefits of Section 106 agreements and we are working closely with a number of developers on new projects – so watch this space for new property opportunities!

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HOW WE USE YOUR PERSONAL DATA

You will probably have noticed lots of emails and information on websites about General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) that started around May this year. This was down to a change in the law about how all organisations, including Southway, handle your data.

What does it all mean?

Your privacy rights were strengthened as a result; for example, all organisations, including Southway can only send you marketing information if you have 'opted-in' and given permission to receive this.

You can also ask us to delete records we hold about you, (exceptions being made where there are legitimate reasons to keep these on record).

If you want to know more about the law and your rights, have a look at the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) website; they are the regulator for data protection. We have been working hard to make sure we are using your information responsibly and one of on out website we provide clear information about how we use your data. This information can be found within the Privacy Notice on our website, which covers all our activities and also gives you more information about your rights and our obligations. If you need this in an alternative format, such as large print of Braille, please let us know.

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SUPPORTING VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES

Southway has committed to supporting the Armed Forces Community by signing an Armed Forces Covenant. The covenant is a promise ensuring that those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces, and their families, are treated fairly. Businesses, local authorities, charities and individuals who sign commit to delivering the best possible outcomes for the Armed Forces community.

For Housing Providers such as Southway this includes supporting veterans and their families through the offer of priority housing, employment and apprenticeship opportunities.

Greater Manchester Combined Authority held its first Armed Forces Summit in May. At the summit Southway, alongside many of the region's housing providers, pledged our commitment to the Armed Forces Covenant and committed to delivering a 'guaranteed minimum offer' to veterans and their families.

Manchester Housing Providers gathered at the Imperial War Museum North on 25th October to discuss how best to collectively deliver on this promise. We heard presentations from the Mayor of Greater Manchester, Andy Burnham, and Warren Smith, Lord Lieutenant of Greater Manchester, on how



providers can support at both a regional and local level.

We took part in some brilliant discussions on pathways into housing, and collaborating with other support organisations, including Walking with the Wounded and Nacro, to ensure that we have the tools to help and advise effectively. We will keep you updated on how we plan to deliver on our covenant pledge in 2019.

STAYING WARM AND WELL THIS WINTER

With the winter months approaching it's important to think ahead and be prepared for the cold weather, as it can affect your health. Keep yourself well and your home warm during winter by following these easy steps:

- 1. Wear **multiple thin layers** of clothing; they will keep you warmer than one thick layer, as the layers trap warm air.
- 2. A lot of heat is lost through the head and neck, so if you're chilly indoors, **try wearing a warm scarf**, **shawl or hat.**
- 3. Get your flu vaccination, if you're eligible it's free!
- Heat your rooms to at least 18°C / 21°C. Draw your curtains as soon as it gets dark to stop the heat escaping and the draughts coming in.
- Keep moving! Staying active keeps you fit and healthy and also generates heat to keep you warm. Try to move around at least once an hour and if your mobility is limited, try moving your arms and legs while sitting or just wiggling your fingers and toes.
- 6. Your body keeps warm by burning food you've eaten, so make sure you have regular hot meals that contain carbohydrates like potatoes, pasta, bread and rice. Try porridge with hot milk for breakfast and soups and stews for lunch and dinner.

- Wear warm clothes in bed; when it's really cold, wear thermal underwear, bed socks and even a hat.
- It's important that you don't run out of your medication over winter; remember to order prescriptions ahead of time. It's also a good idea to keep simple cold, flu and sore throat remedies at home, just in case you become unwell.
- Keep your spirits up it's not unusual to feel down in winter, particularly as the days get shorter. Try to do something you enjoy every day and keep in contact with friends and family by phone if you can't get out and about.
- 10. You might be eligible for financial support to make your home more energy efficient, to improve your heating or help with bills – check our website or contact our Advice Team for more help and information.

IMPROVE YOUR DIGITAL LITERACY WITH A FREE DIGITAL QUALIFICATION

Southway has become the first housing association to launch a free, globally recognized digital literacy qualification for tenants, that teaches essential IT skills for the work place.

We recently moved our office to West Didsbury so we could provide improvements, such as state-or-the-art, digital services for tenants.

At the same time we launched the new "IC3 Digital Literacy" course for tenants and staff. Those people that sign up for the new initiative are provided with comprehensive online training via a video course, with practice tests and a final online exam.

Successful candidates will be able to use the qualification to prove their digital skills to potential employees and develop the knowledge needed to get a job that involves regular use of IT. Joe Sandwick, Southway's Digital Inclusion Officer said, "We are very excited to launch this programme for our tenants, particularly with our older tenants who often feel excluded with the relentless drive towards digital services. By completing an IC3 certification, tenants will benefit from something as simple as being able to keep in touch with relatives and friends which can be of enormous importance and often taken for granted by younger, digitally savvy people. It is also a fantastic opportunity for younger tenants who are looking to improve their digital literacy skills in order to help them find work."

Karen Mitchell, Chief Executive, Southway Housing said,

"We have been running a small-scale pilot with staff members for some months now and the take- up and feedback has been very positive. As an organisation that is committed to developing sustainable communities in which people feel included and valued, it is important for us to give something back. We hope that through the IC3 certification, our tenants will have an even greater chance to succeed in life and take advantage of the huge growth in employment that is currently underway in Manchester.

As the digital economy grows, we want to make sure that our tenants are equipped to apply for these opportunities that come up. Having a globally recognised digital certification will certainly help in terms of recognition from employers, as well as giving them the confidence to succeed.

I myself will be taking the certification once the dust settles on our current office move."

Laptop Loan

Did you know that Southway lends up to 20 free laptops to tenants? They're available to keep for up to three months and tenants don't need to worry if they don't have internet access, as this can be provided in the form of a MiFi device. Contact us to apply.

Help buying a computer

If you are interested in buying a computer, Southway tenants get discount at 'Computer Recyclers' – just contact us to find out how to claim this discount.

1:1 support

Our Digital Champions can offer 1:1 help with using your computer;. if you need a little help, or have a niggling question, just let us know and we will put you in touch with one of our champions.

Or, if you are in a position where you are competent with computers and would like to volunteer your time to become a Digital Champion, we'd love to hear from you! You'll get involve with helping out on computer courses and 1:1 tutoring. Full training will be provided and it's stand-out experience on your CV!

We also offer a free computer course called 'Internet Savvy' which can can help you with:

- Basic computer skills (switching on the computer, using a mouse, etc.)
- Setting up an email address
- Providing advice on the best and cheapest equipment and internet deals
- Searching online for jobs
- Signing up to the Southway portal (so that you can book repairs online)
- Using the internet to save money

At the end of the course, Southway will pay half the cost of a laptop, and can advise on the cheapest way to get online.
