Your Neighbourhood officers have been working with the Neighbourhood Crime Team to charge prolific shoplifter. He received a 31 month sentence and an indefinite Criminal Behaviour Order.

Increase in burglaries in the Chorlton area

Whilst we are working on finding the offender of these crimes, please be extra vigilant and ensure you report any suspicious activity through 101 or 999 if an emergency.

Burglars will use a variety of ways to avoid being noticed.

They don't want to be seen or heard by a neighbour or passerby because they will feel exposed and identifiable.

Distraction burglars will pretend to be someone they are not, so it's important you are aware of the common methods they will use to get you to let them into your property.

You'd think that it would be best to make a property less visible from the street, and to keep it hidden from prying eyes behind overgrown bushes, trees, high fences or walls. In reality, all that this serves to do is make it easier for a burglar to get close to a home unnoticed, and provide somewhere to hide while carrying out a burglary or theft from the property.

Catalytic Converter Theft Advice

We have noticed an increase in the theft of catalytic convertors over the past few weeks

What you can do to stop them?

- Buy a catalytic converter anti-theft plate: they typically cost £20-£30.
- Park your car so the exhaust is close to a kerb, fence or wall to make access difficult.
- Ask your local garage to weld the bolts on your catalytic converter to make it more difficult to remove.

ASB

We have seen an increase in reports of ASB incidents in the Parrs Wood area.

Antisocial behaviour is defined as 'behaviour by a person which causes, or is likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to persons not of the same household as the person'

Reporting incidents is essential in helping us prevent ASB and identify offenders.

Safer Roads Initiative

After feedback that speeding and driving standards are one of the community's greatest concerns. We are regularly conducting Safer Road initiatives in various different areas to tackle this problem. We post our updates on our Facebook and Twitter pages.

The latest operation was Tuesday 17th January along Parrs Wood Road.

While only there for a short period of time officers issued x2 tickets for excess speed, 41mph & 42mph within a 30mph zone. Also, x5 drivers were advised on driving standards.
